Last week Blake forwarded an email to adults discussing a Troop Campership program for families finding themselves impacted by lay-offs and the potential implications that has on the ability to pay for Bartle summer camp. The email generated inquires from families interested in knowing more about Campership for their Scout, as well as generous offers to provide funding for the program. The Campership program was discussed at the April 5<sup>th</sup> Troop Committee Meeting, which was attended by our Sponsoring organization, the Leawood Lions Club.

First and foremost, please know that funding will not be an issue that precludes any Troop 10 Scout from attending Bartle who wants to attend. Please have your Scout participate in the April 6<sup>th</sup> Bartle sign-up meeting, and get registered for camp!

If your family is experiencing financial hardship that impacts your ability to afford camp at this point, you may contact Blake Williams, Troop Committee Chairman, or John Martin, Troop Treasurer to request a Campership. If you are not comfortable in discussing your situation directly with a member of the Scout Troop, please contact Gary Flick with the Leawood Lions Club to discretely request a Campership for your son. Your conversation with any of us will be held in strict confidence, and you and your son's personal situation will not be discussed with others within in the Troop.

Donations to the Troop Campership program are being directed through the Leawood Lions Club Foundation. The Lion's Foundation operates under a 501-c-3 charter, and is tax deductible in most circumstances.
