All food will be prepared and provided by Camp Naish (be sure to eat dinner before you arrive on Friday evening or bring a sandwich to eat there.)

There is no parking at the campsite. We will arrive as a group at a parking/staging area at Naish and be transported to the campsite via shuttle bus. There can be no stragglers or late arrivals. If you miss the shuttle bus you will have to come back Saturday morning and take the Saturday morning bus.

What to bring:

Scouts:

- Completed 'Departure Permission Form' (if you must leave the Campout early)
- Uniform – Scout T-shirt during the day. Wear full Class A to the Stage Show.
- Sleeping bag
- Appropriate clothing (it can get cold at night in late September)
- Appropriate walking shoes/ Boots
- Rain gear
- Toiletries
- Hat, Sunglasses and Sunscreen
- Personal first aid kit
- Handbook
- Canteen or water bottle

- Mess Kit (bowl, plate, insulated cup, knife, fork, spoon)
- Small flashlight
- Camera
- Money – for the Trading Post
- Pad or mat to sit on at the Stage Show
- No Patrol Box or Food will be needed.
- Pack light. You will be carrying your gear in and out.

Adults: Bring your own tent and other gear but leave the cot at home. We are not car camping this time, so pack light, you will be carrying your gear in and out.

Patrols: Work together to make sure that tents are brought to the campout by assigned patrol members. Call your patrol leader, if he doesn't call you by Wednesday, Sept. 22nd.

The coordinating patrol is **Badger**. All Quartermasters and Badger patrol members are responsible for loading and unloading the truck. The truck will be loaded on Thursday, September 16th at 6:00PM and unloaded after the campout on Sunday Sept 26th. Please check with Mr. Gibson for the time on Sunday.
